



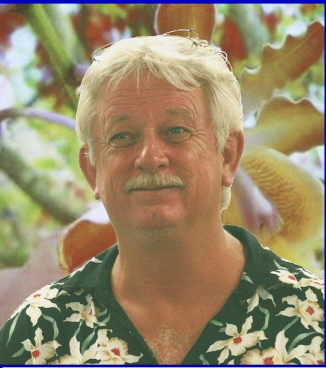

JUNE SPEAKER: WEYMAN BUSSEY

Raised in Belle Glade and educated in Ornamental Horticulture and Botany at the University of Florida, Weyman's love for orchids began at age 12 when he collected his first orchid in the Big Cypress swamps during a Boy Scout camping trip. A trip to the 7th World Orchid Conference in Colombia at the age of 17, inspired him to live and work in the tropics where he could be nearest his real passion, wild orchids. He not only grew them commercially, but built many companies and laboratories throughout his career, not just for orchids, but also other flower crops in Colombia and Mexico. His favorite past time for 30 years was rescuing plants from fallen trees and finding them a home. In his

sought after presentation about Mexican orchids, given to over 75 societies during the past 20 years, he shows you how the geography of Mexico has influenced the evolution of more than a thousand species. Do you know the WANTS orchids have? This presentation is much more than a bunch of pretty flower pictures, it takes you into real Old Mexico in depth, teaches you how to choose the Mexican native orchid species best suited for your climate.

Greg looks for photographic balance and symmetry as well as those characteristics unique to each orchid that delights us and leaves us gasping for more.

My favorites were the pure white *Lycaste shoalhaven*, the champagne pink bubbles flowing out into the glowing petal edges of *Paphiopedilum hamlets quest*, the hypnotic, dark-purple spiral pattern of *Phalaenopsis brother glory*. And of course, Greg captured the mouth-watering features that have made *Phragmipedium kovachii* notorious.

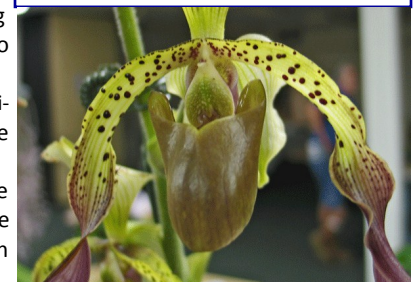

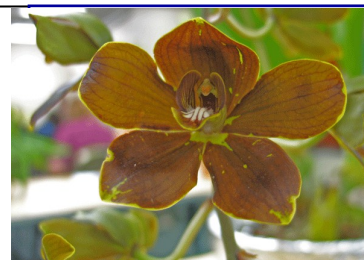

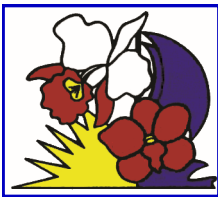
