### MAY SPEAKER: LUIS DEL PINO BY LOREN COLBURN

The FLOS May speaker was Luis Del Pino from Rio Orchid. Luis purchased Rio Orchids



from Ruben Sauleda and continues Rubens work. Rio Orchid is one of two labs in the US that produces flasks of plants for many of the growers where we buy our orchids. They grow their plants from seeds they have produced or client seeds, the flasks are then sold

to growers. Luis's talk took us from the pollination of a flower to a new flowering plant. He outlined the process from the amount of time each step can take and the issues that

can happen to kill the plant. The first step is the pollination of the flower, once pollinated the seed pod will begin to grow. This process can take up to 18 months for some varieties, and face many hazards before getting to the lab the

as a healthy pod. Then once in the lab millions of seeds are transferred to the in nature 1 to 2 plants will reach germi-

nation, in Luis lab they have 98% success rate. The flasking is a time consuming and detailed process over the next 26 to 28 months till the plants will be ready to come out of the flasks. Once ready they are taken and moved to more regular growing area – not potted but on a bed of hydronic media – once larger they will be potted then 3 -5 years they will flower.

The steps to clone a plant were also covered – 5000 clones can be made from a single award winning plant that will be exactly like the parent plant. This process, like the growing from seed, takes almost 2 years before a plant is large enough to pot and then several more years to a flowering plant. The only difference is that you know exactly what you will be getting.
