# MARCH PROGRAM:

# TOMAS BEJZA

Our March speaker was Tomas Bejza, his talk was 'Giant World of Miniature Orchids' and how to grow cool in Florida. Tomas came to Miami 15 years ago, and started growing orchids about 10 years ago, with warehouse store orchids. While in an orchid user group he read

about a Lepanthopsis astrophora, his first miniature orchid. He soon was hooked on micro and miniature orchids, he also did not follow the general rule of what orchids can grow in South Florida. He purchased and killed many plants until he figured out the tricks to cool growing and miniature orchids. Tomas grows many of the orchids in glass containers and on bonsai trees to create some truly beautiful and unusual orchid displays.

The orchids species which grow well in glass are moisture loving species. He uses living sphagnum moss in the bottom of the glass to start and then mounts all the orchids. He uses multiple types of mounting material, cork, dense cork or wood, the only mounting material that should be avoided is tree fern which stays too wet. Watering and feeding is just like the big plants but with 1/4 strength food. Using these steps Tomas can grow many cool loving miniatures in his apartment in Miami, he has a large glass container with over 45 plants on a single mount.

For the miniatures that are cool loving Tomas had multiple tricks to get the orchids to grow and bloom. He keeps them in air-conditioning very cool at night 60's. Then when the cool weather comes he takes them camping. The orchids live outside for the cool months of the year. The cool nights even down to the 40's will work. He then identified some that he grows this way:

-Dendrobium gregulus - miniature cool loving dendrobium from Thailand;

-Lepanthes telipogoniflora grows inside year around so that it doesn't get eaten;

-Lepanthopsis Astrophora with beautiful glittery blooms grows great mounted in a glass container.

Tomas had a table of the miniatures for sale, some mounted and in glass, he will also have a table at the Redland show if you missed him at the meeting. (Loren Colburn)
